# THE WESTERN EXPANSION OF NEW YORK STATE AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SPRINGWATER, NY

To understand the creation of the Town of Springwater in 1816, it helps to look at a timeline of the political divisions in




1772—Tryon County, in red, also included all the western Indian lands.<sup>1</sup>

this part of the state. The creation of various counties and towns began in 1683 with the creation of Albany County<sup>5</sup>. Over the next century and a half, many changes were made to the area originally called Albany County in the Province of New York, providing a graphic image of the exploration and settling of Europeans across New York .

Between 1683 and 1772,



various lines were drawn defining the north and east boundaries of Albany County.

Of interest to us was the creation of Tryon County in 1772 with the county seat in Johnsville, and containing all of the

land in New York west of the new Albany County. The county was named after the last provincial governor of New York, so the name was changed to Montgomery County after the Revolution.



Ontario County to the west - 1790<sup>3</sup>

Following the creation of the United States, both Massachusetts and New York

claimed the western lands of New York. The Treaty of Hartford, in 1786, established the current shape of New York. A north-south line (the Preemption Line) was drawn west of the current city of Geneva. All lands west of the line were considered part of New York.

They were owned by the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) Indians and Massachusetts had "pre-emption" rights to purchase the land from the Haudenosaunee. In 1788, Massachusetts sold their rights to Phelps & Gorham. In 1789, the land west of the Pre-emption line was removed from Montgomery County and became Ontario County<sup>6</sup>.

The Holland Purchase 4

In 1803, Genesee County was created from Ontario to handle the lands in the Holland Purchase. The map to the right drawn in 1825,

shows the land in the 1803 Genesee County. Note that the town of Sparta remained as the westernmost town of Ontario County. On April 7, 1817<sup>7</sup>, five and a half miles were taken from the town of Naples, and 3 miles were taken from the town of Sparta to form Springwater. Finally, in 1821, the counties of Monroe and Livingston were created from Ontario and Genesee Counties. Since that time changes to Springwater have been minor.
